MAP Testing - Fall Baseline

Be on the lookout!

BBMS Students will take their MAP test soon!

Math MAP = October 4, 5, 8

ELA/Reading MAP = October 10, 11, 12

MAP Scores? What is a MAP score? Does my child need to study?

Do you find yourself asking this question sometimes?

Students take a MAP test in their ELA and Math class twice each year in October and in February. Those results are used in a number of ways in school. At BBMS, we use this to help us determine if students are making academic progress as they get ready for high school. We also look to see if scores reflect a student's performance in that class and does it match up with the grades they are getting. Students will receive a score immediately after taking the test.

Students do not need to study for the MAP test. The purpose of the test is to give teachers a sense of how students are progressing in MATH and ELA/Reading. Teachers use results from MAP to inform their instruction and to see where students may need more support.

MAP testing in October and February helps our teachers see if students are making progress which will help prepare them for PARCC testing in May and help students get ready for their next course in sequence.

Finally, remember that this is one data point out of many that we use to monitor student growth. Together, they all help paint a vivid picture of your child's performance in school.
