**Before/After School Programs:** Here are some updates about programs available to support students at BBMS. If you are interested in seeing if your student would benefit from one of these programs, please contact us!

- English Language Learner Support Program: Mr. Brinson, Ms. Jimenez, and Ms. Cohen-Holbrook work with students on Thursday afternoons from 3-4:30pm. The focus of this group is to build ELA and Math skills for those with emerging English language skills.
- Writing Workshop: Ms. Anthony-Williams is working with 6<sup>th</sup> grade students to improve their writing in an after school workshop setting.
- **Homework Help:** Ms. Wrenn has a group of students who meet to get their homework finished after school.
- Ms. Koslowski oversees a mentoring program that meets during Shark Tutorial on Thursdays and then extends after school if students and mentors are able to stay. This one-to-one mentoring is meant to help students in all areas that they want assistance with; including math and writing.
- AM Shark School: This program meets before school on Wednesdays and Thursdays with a focus on math and English skills. Students meet at 6:45am, have activity time until 7:00am where breakfast is served, then teachers pick them up from the cafeteria and teach lessons until 8:00am. Programs exist for students in all grades 6 to 8.

Other groups who meet after school include Math Counts, Drama Productions, Art Club, and the Step Team. There are more and more options to get students connected with programs at BBMS – thank you to everyone involved for making this happen!

And remember, we have an ACTIVITY BUS that runs on Thursdays after school at 4:30pm to help students access these programs.
