Hello BBMS Families,

1. MAP Testing - results are in! Did you see them? If not, please contact your student's ELA or Math teacher. We are in the process of reviewing our school's data and we will share that with you once it is summarized. We use MAP data when we make instructional decisions on the school level, teachers use this information in their classes to help inform their instruction, and students and parents can use this data to help make decisions about what courses to take in middle and high school. We look to see if students made growth from the fall and whether they met their grade level benchmark. If you have any questions about your child's score, please talk with our teachers, counselors, or administrators. We are here to help all students achieve their full potential and this is one indicator (not the only one) that helps us provide students with the supports they need.

2. International Night - March 16. Our Student Council, the PTA, and teachers have been busy organizing a fun and informing event for everyone in our community. International Night will take place from 6:30pm to 8:30pm on March 16 at BBMS. We will have food, performances, and cultural displays designed to celebrate the rich diversity of our community.
