Safety Drills - Student and staff safety is our highest priority. As part of our comprehensive

safety plan, we conduct various drills throughout the year (evacuation, lockdown, shelter in place, etc.). The purpose of these drills is to practice procedures and to prepare for real emergency situations. On Friday, we conducted two emergency drills. Students did an excellent job participating in the evacuation and reverse evacuation drill, as evidenced by the focus and safe behavior they demonstrated throughout the entire emergency preparation scenario.

Policy 8020: Grading and Reporting Middle and High School specifies that student behaviors may not be used to reduce a student's grade. "Student behaviors, including but not limited to, lateness to class, absence (however, per Section IV.A.4., excessive absences may result in loss of credit), or disciplinary action, may not be used to reduce a student's grade. However, student behaviors and attendance may impact the student's grade indirectly because of missed instructional time and incomplete assignments." Wearing or changing into a specific uniform for physical education class is not part of the physical education standards, curriculum, requirements, or expectations. Students' grades should not be reduced due to a failure to wear a specific uniform for class. Students should not be required to change or wear specific uniforms for class nor should they be required to purchase uniforms from the school in order to participate or maintain a grade. Students should be able to participate in the active portion of the class, as long as they are meeting the guidelines for physical education dress as indicated. Students who are not dressed safely to participate should be given an assignment aligned to the current unit of study and should participate in a non-active role in class.
