(1) MAP TESTING:

- Students will be assessed in Reading (October 7) and Math (October 14) using the MAP Test. Instructions will be provided by PERIOD 3 TEACHERS next week to ensure all students can access MAP testing materials. Students will test with their period 3 teacher on October 7 and 14 even though it is a Wednesday and students don't normally have class. Students can choose to take the test in the morning (9-11:00am) or in the afternoon (1-3:00pm). We are offering two times to help families juggle schedules those days.
- Wednesday, October 7: Reading Test. Students will choose the 9am or 1pm time slot. Students login with their regular period 3 teacher using the Google Meet code they use every other day. Teachers will give students instructions from there.
- Wednesday, October 14: Math Test. Again, students will choose the 9am or 1pm time slot. Students login with their regular period 3 teacher using the Google Meet code they use every other day. Teachers will give students instructions from there.

The Howard County Public School System's BSAP Saturday Math Academy (BSAP-SMA) has been in existence since 1992. The program was developed in collaboration with the HCPSS and parents as a response to requests for opportunities to network. The priority was to learn instructional mathematical strategies to support their children at home and to accelerate academic achievement.

(6) HCPSS Family Mathematics Support Center: there is a tab for "Middle School Math" which break each course down by units. Inside you will find practice problems, solutions, and more. (8) HCPSS 2020 Seasonal Flu Vaccine Clinics: Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, obtaining a vaccine for seasonal influenza (flu) is even more important this year than ever. HCPSS Health Services is continuing its partnership with the Howard County Health Department (HCHD) and the Maryland Partnership for Prevention (MPP) to offer several regional seasonal flu vaccine clinics for HCPSS students and staff during the month

of October. The clinic dates are October 7-14. The clinics will be held at 24 school sites, outdoors, from 4:00-6:00 p.m., and ANY HCPSS student or staff may attend ANY clinic they wish; pre-registration with appointments will be required. Registration starts on Monday, September 21 and closes on Wednesday, September 30. Register at www.vaccineconsent.com and search by location for flu clinics.

Wednesday, October 7 – AHS, CHS, DLES, SFES Thursday, October 8 – GHS, WLHS, JHES, ARL Friday, October 9 – MRHS, HOHS, LWES, HMS Monday, October 12 – RHS, MHHS, BWES, CRES Tuesday, October 13 – OMHS, HCMS, LES, DRES Wednesday, October 14 – RHHS, LRHS, GCES, LFES

The health room staff at the schools will coordinate with administration and custodial services on logistics; the clinics will be held outside and will be drive-up clinics. Students and staff may stay in their car when they are vaccinated, or they can sit outside at a table if they walk up. All parties will be required to use appropriate PPE and all social distancing measures will be employed.
